Salisbury is the fourth largest local economy in South Australia by Gross regional Product and third largest in relation to local jobs

Headline economic figures include:

- Gross Regional Product of \$6.429 billion
- 7,234 actively trading businesses providing 54,221 jobs
- **71,726** residents in the workforce with an 8.4% unemployment rate (up from 7.9% for the same period in 2018).

Investment Snapshot

Approximately **\$3.4 billion** of investment (minimum value of \$5 million per project) across 56 projects is currently underway or proposed within Salisbury.

- \$96 million of projects proposed but not yet commenced.
- \$44.4 million of projects lodged for development assessment (either with Council or the State Government) including La Casa Del Formaggio and an addition to a private nursing home in Salisbury South.
- \$255 million of projects that have received development approval but are yet to commence including South Australian Produce Market expansion at Pooraka, Holco, DeLorean bioenergy plant, ,10 storey mixed use development at Mawson Lakes, GIC Kings Point retail and leisure precinct development, Edenfield Family Care and St Basil's aged care.
- \$2.2 billion underway including the Northern Connector, Edinburgh
 Defence Base upgrade, Salisbury Community Hub, , Huhtamaki
 distribution centre, Veroguard manufacturing facility, Aldi Salisbury,
 Metro Parade mixed use development, Helping Hand Aged Care,
 various defence contracts and school upgrades for Endeavour College,
 Thomas Moore College and Bethany School.
- \$766 million of recently completed projects.



Polaris Centre Activity Snapshot

The Polaris Business and Innovation Centre is the City of Salisbury's hub for the provision of business support, urban planning and economic development services. Headline figures include:

- **Investment Attraction** currently working with **16 firms** on relocation proposals
- Business Expansion worked with 8 firms on expansion plans
- Business Information provided to 431 individual firms so far this financial year
- Start Up Support provided to 58 intenders and early stage firms so far this financial year
- Client satisfaction 96% (New Focus survey average)

Development Applications

For the period October to December 2019, \$58.7 million worth of development applications were approved by Council. This compares to \$45.9 million for the same period in the previous financial year. Larger commercial developments (value exceeding \$5 million) lodged or approved in this period include:

- \$5 million Booth Australia transport
- \$5 million Alterations and additions to private nursing home in Salisbury South
- \$9.5 million Parafield Gardens R-7 and High Schools upgrade
- \$9.5 million Paralowie R-12 schools upgrade
- \$18 million Holco Fine Meat Suppliers expansion
- \$30 million Raytheon Australia Centre for Joint Integration
